



## ***MadLib: My Memorable Camping Trip***

### ***Reading – Grade 4-6***

**Students work together to fill in the blanks of this MadLib story about a memorable camping trip, then read the story aloud.**

Materials:

- Pen or pencil
- Print out of the MadLib story (attached)

Instructions:

This may be done in pairs or as a group. Have one student be the scribe to jot down group answers. Pick one word for each blank. The scribe should ask the group for words to fill in the blank spaces, such as, “I need a noun, raise your hand to fill in this blank.” After all the answers are compiled for each blank space, the scribe then reads the story.

Repeat with a different scribe if desired.
